Competitive pay isn't all it takes to recruit and retain great nonprofit employees—but it's essential. And inflation has impacted what it takes to make nonprofit salaries competitive.

All nonprofits will need to invest time and effort in 2023 to establish and maintain fair, equitable compensation standards for their teams.
